The JFBB shows about 50 films in two competitions for feature and documentary films, and thematic special sections. The JFBB will take place from 18-23 June mainly in Berlin and Potsdam but also in other cities in the Federal State of Brandenburg. Patron of the festival is the minister of state for culture and media, Claudia Roth.
